PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Members,

299 members. 7.4% below December 2024. Professional members down 10.7%.

I want to start there, because membership is the one number that answers a question every association should be able to answer: are we worth joining? Seventy years of history does not settle this for us. Every Council, every year, has to earn it.

My ambition for this term is simple to state and hard to deliver. I want LAS to be the professional home every librarian in Singapore chooses without hesitation, the place where the serious thinking of our profession actually happens. The decline this year tells me we have not made that case hard enough. The work in the pages that follow is where we begin.

LAS turned 70 in 2025. We marked the milestone with a commemorative book, a dinner where about 80 past and present members traded stories and toasted seven decades of work, and a "Then and Now" Kahoot quiz that reminded us how much has changed – and how much has not. Seven decades on, the question we still need to answer is the one that led a small group to form the Malayan Library Group in 1955: what does it mean to be a professional body for librarians in this country?

Our answer this year took concrete form. The **LAS Competency Framework for Information Professionals** was endorsed by Council in July 2025 – a first for our profession here. Phoebe Lim led the workgroup, with Gee Miaw Miin, Jennifer Chor, and Jonathan Pradusook. It is now on the LAS website, open for every member to use, test, and comment on. The **Professional Development Scheme 2.0**, anchored to the Framework, enters its testing phase from August to December 2026.

Around that theme, each committee did specific work worth naming. The Training & Development Committee ran four Brown Bag sessions that drew 171 participants and issued seven Learning Alerts since inception. Publications, led by Lee Meiyu, delivered eight SLB articles, a new SJLIM volume, the 70th Anniversary Commemorative Book, and – working with NLB and NUS Libraries – digitised our past journals and newsletters so seventy years of documentary heritage now sit online, open to researchers. Web & IT, led by Sandie Loo, rebuilt the LAS website in April 2025 and brought in Google Analytics so we decide with data, not intuition. Publicity, chaired by Sarah Ruslan, launched our LinkedIn page in April 2026, putting us on the platform our members already live on. Programmes & Engagement, chaired by Fa'izah Ahmad, convened 141 members and friends across three events, including two walk-throughs of NLB's SG60 exhibitions hosted by Gene Tan.

Special thanks to the 2023–2025 Council led by Soh Lin Li, who handed this Council a strong foundation; to Vice-President Ian Yap, who led the 70th Anniversary evening and the Awards Panel; and to every committee member named across these pages. Congratulations to the 2025 award recipients: **Judy Ng** (Lifetime Contribution), **Ruan Yang** (Passion), **Jessie Tang** (Outstanding Newcomer), and **Simon Coates** and **Seow Peck Ngiam** (LAS-WLIC Grant). I also thank our Awards Panel, chaired by Mrs Lee Cheng Ean, for the care with which they assessed this year's nominations.

A library's value is often invisible until you look for it. So is a professional association's. The work of this Council is to make what we do clear enough so that no member, no institution, and no potential member has to guess at it.

Thank you for the first year of this term. I look forward to the next.

LAS Professional Development Scheme 2.0

Launched in 2007, the Professional Development Scheme (PDS) recognises the commitment and achievements of librarians in their ongoing professional training and development.

Following a review that started in 2023, the enhanced PDS 2.0 now integrates the LAS Competency Framework and emphasizes reflective practice to better support holistic professional development.

The award of "**Practising Professional (PP)**" will be given to librarians (personal professional members) who have developed the relevant professional skills and competencies to excel in their work and reflect critically on their profession. Their names will be published on this site in a Practising Professional Register.

The new scheme will enter the testing phase from August to December 2026.

Summary of activities from 2025 to 2026:

Guided Tour of Heart & Soul (SG60 Heart & Soul Experience) – 23 Oct 2025

Heart & Soul refers to the SG60 Heart & Soul Experience, Singapore's SG60 flagship exhibition jointly organised by the Ministry of Digital Development and Information (MDDI) and the National Library Board (NLB). The exhibition presented an immersive, multi-sensory journey through Singapore's past, present, and future, making use of interactive storytelling and generative AI to personalise each visitor's experience.

The LAS Committee supported and engaged with this national exhibition as part of its broader commitment to promoting libraries, heritage, and public understanding of Singapore's knowledge institutions. Participants were personally welcomed by Gene Tan, NLB Deputy Chief Executive Officer (Strategy & Experiences) who provided a comprehensive guided tour of the exhibition site, offering in-depth insights into its curatorial vision and experiential design. A total of about 30 LAS members and friends participated in this tour.



70th Anniversary of the Library Association of Singapore – 14 Nov 2025

The 70th Anniversary of the Library Association of Singapore celebrated seven decades of excellence in advancing Singapore's library and information sector. This milestone event united past and present members, partners, and stakeholders to honour LAS's legacy and reaffirm its mission for the future.

The evening featured welcome cocktails with live jazz entertainment, followed by a commemorative video montage and opening address by LAS President Ms Shameem Nilofar Maideen showcasing the anniversary publication. Around 80 LAS members enjoyed a buffet dinner and participated in an engaging "Then and Now" Kahoot quiz on LAS history and milestones.

The celebration culminated with a ceremonial cake-cutting, group photographs of past and present Council members, and a toast to 70 years of excellence by LAS Vice-President Mr Ian Yap.



Guided Tour of The Albatross File: Singapore's Independence Declassified Exhibition – 6 Feb 2026

The Albatross File: Singapore's Independence Declassified is a permanent exhibition jointly organised by the National Library Board (NLB) and the Ministry of Digital Development and Information (MDDI) as an SG60 capstone initiative. The exhibition is based on the book *The Albatross File: Inside Separation* and features newly declassified documents, archival records, and oral history accounts relating to Singapore's separation from Malaysia between 1963 and 1965.

The LAS Programme Committee organised this visit for its members to engage with this significant exhibition. Around 31 participants were personally welcomed by Mr Gene Tan, NLB Deputy Chief Executive Officer (Strategy & Experiences), who provided a comprehensive tour of the exhibition. The programme was further enriched by a question-and-answer session with the staff responsible for curating and mounting this significant exhibition, offering participants valuable insights into the research process, curatorial decisions, and the challenges of presenting such sensitive historical material to the public.

The LAS Committee supported engagement with this exhibition as part of its role in fostering historical awareness, professional learning, and appreciation of Singapore's documentary heritage among library professionals.

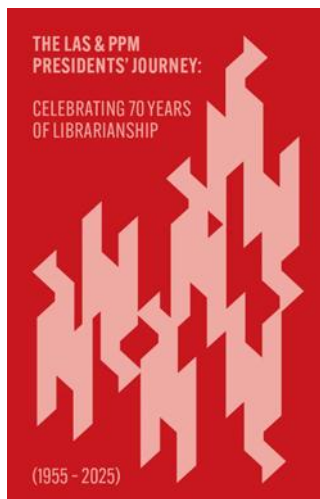

70th Anniversary Commemorative Book

Digitization and Online Access to LAS past journals and newsletters

LAS was established in 1955 as the Malayan Library Group, the first professional body for librarians in Singapore and Malaya. Through collaboration with the National Library Board and the National University of Singapore Libraries, past issues of LAS journals and newsletters were digitised to preserve LAS's documentary heritage and make regional library history accessible to researchers. LAS Website Revamp

Following the successful launch of the new LAS website, enhancements were made to improve usability, security, and overall user experience. Google Analytics was implemented to support data-driven improvements. In collaboration with the Publications team, past LAS journals and newsletters were made available online, and the Directory of Libraries in Singapore was published.

LAS Website

With the implementation of Google Analytics, website performance is now being tracked, with the data serving as a baseline for future reporting. Since January 2026, the website has recorded approximately 2,700 users and over 8,200 page views, with an average engagement time of just over one minute. The most visited sections include the events calendar, job opportunities, and membership portal, indicating strong user interest in these areas. While the majority of users are from Singapore, the website also attracts an international audience, including users from the United States and Hong Kong. Efforts will be made to improve user retention and ongoing engagement.

LAS Job Portal

The number of job postings has shown a declining trend over the past three years, decreasing from approximately 40 in 2023 to 24 in 2024, and 20 in the current reporting period (May 2025 – April 2026).

Establishing the Publicity Committee's Operational Foundation

In 2025/2026, the Publicity Committee focused on building the foundational structures needed to operate effectively and sustainably. Key initiatives included:

- Social media strategy – covering platform approach, content pillars, and posting guidelines for Facebook and LinkedIn
- Publicity guidelines & workflow – governing end-to-end request handling, team roles, platform monitoring, and approval process
- Publicity Resources Microsite – an internal resource for various committees, consolidating publicity related resources in one accessible location

Building and Sustaining Our Social Media Presence

Communications Channel Audit

In January 2026, the committee conducted a communications channel audit to streamline LAS's social media presence. This resulted in the deactivation of the LAS X (formerly Twitter) account and the consolidation of LAS's YouTube presence into a single official channel.

Launch of LAS LinkedIn Page

The establishment of LAS's LinkedIn page was a key initiative of the committee this term, marking a significant step in expanding the association's professional presence online.

LinkedIn was identified as an appropriate platform for LAS given its strong alignment with LAS's target audience – library and information professionals for whom LinkedIn is already a primary professional networking tool. The platform will position LAS alongside peer associations internationally in establishing a credible professional voice in the library and information sector.

The LinkedIn page was soft-launched in April 2026, with a formal launch planned at the AGM on 23 May 2026.

Sustaining our Facebook Presence

The LAS Facebook page continued to serve as the association's primary social media presence during the 2025/2026 term. Key metrics are reported below. Interactions – which include reactions, comments, shares, saves, and replies across all content – are used as the primary measure of audience engagement on the platform.

CHRONOLOGY OF LAS

- 1955** Formation of the Malayan Library Group on 25 March 1955.
- 1958** Name changed to Library Association of Malaya and Singapore.
- 1960** Association dissolved and two new groups were formed due to the Federation government's policy to not grant registration to pan-Malayan associations:
- Persatuan Perpustakaan Tanah Melayu (Library Association of Malaya)
 - Library Association of Singapore
- 1964** Library Association of Singapore was reconstituted as the Library Association of Malaya, Singapore Branch, after the merger between Singapore and Malaya.
- 1966** The Singapore Branch became an independent body after Singapore's separation from Malaysia. The Persatuan Perpustakaan Singapore (Library Association of Singapore) was formed.
- 1972** The Association was renamed as the Library Association of Singapore (LAS) on 25 March 1972.
- 2005** The Association celebrated its Golden Jubilee on 15 November 2005.
- 2007** The Association held its conference on the theme *Librarians, Strengthening, Moving Forward from 29 to 31 January 2007*.
- The Association accorded Mrs Hedwig Anuar the first LAS Lifetime Contribution Award on 1 November 2007.
- 2008** The Association gave out the LAS Professional Service award to three winners: Ms Lau Siew Kheng, Ms Manijeh Namazie, and Mr R. Ramachandran, at the Istana Reception on 9 May 2008.
- The Association held the LAS Conference 2008 on the theme *Innovate to Serve* on 8 to 9 May 2008.
- The LAS Professional Development Scheme was launched on 25 August 2008.
- 2009** 136 LAS professional members from the first five batches were given the Practising Professional award under the PDS scheme.

The Association accorded the LAS Professional Service Award to Ms Sylvia Yap at the LAS Tri-event held on 16 October 2009.

The Tri-event also saw the launch of the inaugural LAS Library School award, Scholarship, which was awarded to Mr Herman Felani bin Md Yunos.

Professor Tommy Koh, Ambassador-at-Large and Patron of LAS, was invited to give out the LAS Lifetime Contribution Award to Ms Rosemary Yeap at the LAS Annual Dinner held at the Pod on 16 October 2009.

2010

Launch of first online volume of the Singapore Journal of Library and Information Management on 25 January 2010. The table of contents and full text of the articles for Volume 38 are open access and available to everyone. The journal is no longer available in hard copy.

Launch of LAS first entry level (WSQ Level 2) training programme for library support staff on *Support General Reference and Information Enquiry*. This was the first of the five competency-based programmes which form the WSQ Higher Certificate in Library and Information Services. All 5 modules were developed by LAS and approved by WDA by end 2010.

The 2010 LAS Awards were presented by our Guest of Honour, Dr N. Varaprasad at the LAS Awards Ceremony and Hi-Tea event held on 15 January 2011 at the Rendezvous Hotel.

The Association accorded the LAS Lifetime Contribution Award to Datin Patricia Lim Pui Huen.

The LAS Professional Service Award 2010 was presented to Mr Choy Fatt Cheong.

Mr Nurhazman Abdul Aziz, from NTU Library, became the first award winner of the LAS Outstanding Newcomer Award, which was launched in 2009.

The LAS Library School Scholarship 2010 was presented to Ms Samantha Thanh Giang Vu by Ms Puspa Yeow, President of LAS.

Debby Wegener, from TP Library, became the first award winner of the LAS Special Librarian Passion Award, which was launched in 2010.

2011

The LAS website was revamped with a fresh design and features that now allow online registration, renewal and payment for both membership and conferences.

LAS initiated a social media presence on Facebook and Twitter (<http://facebook.com/las.org.sg>; http://twitter.com/las_org_sg) in September 2011.

The *Libraries for Tomorrow II* seminar was held on 14 April 2011 at Biopolis using social media tools such as Twitter and SMS to encourage spontaneous interaction at the seminar.

First Asia-Pacific Library & Information Conference (APLIC) Jointly Organised with ALIA and LIANZA

The APLIC was jointly organised by the Australian Library and Information Association (ALIA), Library and Information Association of New Zealand (LIANZA), and LAS. Held in Gold Coast, Australia from 30 July to 3 August 2018, its organisation started more than a year ago with Council members, Judy Ng, Low Jiabin, and Phoebe Lim being part of the organising committee. At the conference, President Samantha Ang exhorted conference attendees to do their part, using the Singaporean Kallang Roar and Wave as an analogy of how this can only be done with everyone's cooperation. The Singapore party that supported the event included librarians from NLB, SMU, NTU, and NIE.

Professional Development Seminar with SMU

Jointly organised with the SMU Libraries, the two-day seminar in August 2018 attracted more than 80 participants including overseas librarians from Indonesia and Philippines. Topics discussed include design thinking, data visualisation, and career development. The seminar enjoyed the presence of Lisa Hinchliffe, Professor/Coordinator for Information Literacy Services and Instruction University Library, University of Illinois, who did the workshop on Information Literacy Training and Instructional Design Skills Toolkit.

First ever Nature Walk for LAS

A first of its kind, early Saturday morning on 22 September 2018, a nature walk was held in Labrador Park, where librarians were invited to wind down in nature, with art, poetry, and history.

First ever Webinar for LAS

A bold step pioneered through the efforts of the Training & Development committee brought about the inaugural LAS Webinar on 30 November 2018. A total of 67 unique attendees took part in this Webinar. Of which, through the collaboration with the Chinese American Librarians Association, we also attracted 12 overseas librarians to the discussion. Using the WebEx platform, the session managed to yield a 75% media attention-to-attention rating. This is based on the attentiveness of the attendee based on their individual time in the session.

Hosting visiting Indian Librarians from the International Network of Emerging Library Innovators.

Some 30 visiting public librarians under the INELI, India programme visited the Singapore libraries from 12 to 15 November 2018. During their visit, they were given a welcome dinner jointly hosted by the

LAS Conference: Libraries for Tomorrow 2024 (5 November 2024)

LAS Competency Framework for Information Professionals

A Competency Framework Workgroup comprising three members Gee Miaw Miin, Jennifer Chor and Jonathan Pradusook was formed more than a year ago to work on the competency framework. On 27 June 2024, a brainstorming session with a diverse group of LAS members was organized to discuss key elements of the framework.
